

Calgary author and parent educator, Judy Arnall, has written a book for parents who are finding that traditional discipline methods do not work to create the kind of strong bond that will help children face the challenges of the increasingly complex world they live in. She encourages parents to look beyond the behaviour to see the need or feeling that the child is expressing. From this perspective, discipline is less about making children behave and more about teaching children how to solve problems and make good decisions. She addresses issues of parenting from birth to teens, with an emphasis on practical tools that parents will be able to use in daily life.
